ter B's brewery. Rivard is up to the challenge. His brewing history speaks to both his adventurous side beer, and the and his ambition to take Peter B's to the next level.

With his parents' blessing, Rivard started brewing while still in high school. In college, he ventured into cider and mead making before setting his sights on a brewing career.

Logging more than five years in professional brewhouses before moving to California, Rivard worked his way up through the ranks. That included a stint at the award winning Jolly Pumpkin Artisan Ales.

He most recently left Arbor Brewing Co. in Ann Arbor, Michigan to embark on this new Monterey adventure.

"I really wanted to be somewhere where I had a lot of creative control,' says Rivard. "I knew I'd be able to do that at Peter B's. Also, I was captivated by the surrounding beauty.

You can't argue with that. Our area is definitely beautiful and there's a lot to explore, including hiking trails, one of Rivard's hobbies.

He admits that even while spending free time to familiarize himself with his new surroundings, his mind is constantly pondering new recipes.

Since arriving, he's released a double IPA

"I want to push the envelope and brew a myriad of styles," he says, including "a changing variety of specialties, with unique sour and barrel-aged offerings.

Even with his interest in developing a beer list filled with unique flavor profiles, Rivard also holds a special respect for more traditional brewing styles, including those from Germany.

His first ever brew was a German-style Kölsch, which according to Rivard, turned out "incredible."

The current lineup of flagship beers that has established Peter B's as a favorite among locals and visitors alike will remain on tap. However, Rivard can hardly contain his enthusiasm when talking about his many ideas for Peter B's.
